#### From the CEO

The National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA) saw many new developments in the year 2017. It was a year in which our greatest accomplishment was to achieve 84% of our planned initiatives outlined in our strategic plan. This achievement would not have been possible without the support of the Supreme Council of Health and the efforts of all our dedicated staff at NHRA.

The NHRA has issued 16 policies and guidelines, highlighting our procedures and regulations, in relation to licensing facilities, professionals, medicines, advertisement, continuous professional development, accreditation, patient's complaints, reporting incidents and inspection. These policies and guidelines primary aims are to support our clients in a way that promotes collaboration and open communication.

In 2017, the total number of licensed healthcare facilities was 671, that includes 194 medical centres, 21 hospitals and 171 clinics, of which 58% are located in the Capital Governorate.

In this past year, we also saw an increase in the investment of new medical centres and pharmacies. Initial approval was granted to 110 facilities, that included 20 dental centres, 15 general medical centres and 13 alternative medicine centres. The number of new pharmacies licensed in the last year was 51 bringing the total number of pharmacies registered with the Authority to 213 pharmacies.

The number of registered professionals in the Authority for 2017 reached 28,031 that included 6,131 doctors, 14,395 nurses, 4,520 allied health 1,887 pharmacists and 1,098 dentists.

In pursuant of the decision of the Supreme Council of Health to link continuous professional education with the renewal of licenses for healthcare professionals, the authority approved 3,022 continuing professional development training programs. These programs included conferences, workshops, scientific forums and lectures. In the area of clinical trials, the Authority has reviewed and made judgement on 12 clinical trials in the private and public sectors.

The total number of registered pharmaceuticals with the Authority are 3,760 Medicines, 729 Health Products and 311 Alternative Medicine Products. Additionally, the authority reviewed 8,178 medical devices of which 6,861 were approved with a value of approximately 25 million Bahraini dinars.

By far the greatest achievement for us in 2017 was the implementation of the first National Accreditation Program in the Kingdom of Bahrain. Select Healthcare facilities underwent a comprehensive assessment of all services provided by them, ranging from governance and medical care to patient and building safety, infection control, quality and other criteria that impact patient safety and quality. The accreditation team successfully completed surveying 8 private hospitals and 6 affiliated medical centres.

Four hospitals were awarded the diamond level of accreditation, achieving more than 95% of the required standards. Three hospitals were awarded the platinum level of accreditation, achieving between 90% and 94% of the standards. One hospital was awarded the gold level of accreditation achieving between 85% and 89% of the required standards.

As for complaints and medical errors, the Authority received 237 cases last year, of which 136 were direct complaints from patients and 47 were incidents reported from healthcare facilities. Fifty-two cases were referred by the prosecution and the courts, 56% against the private sector and 42% against the government sector.

The Authority completed the investigation on 118 cases of which medical error was proved in only 44 of them.

In total, the authority implemented 66 disciplinary actions on professionals, 47 against doctors and 15 against nurses. The disciplinary proceedings included 34 suspensions, 21 warnings, and 10 license cancellations. A monetary fine was issued for one facility.

In spite of some of the great strides we made in 2017, we also faced our fair share of challenges, one of the biggest being the lack of a comprehensive information system for all our procedures. This IT development encountered numerous technical issues that have contributed to the delay of its implementation. For 2018, we have once again reaffirmed our commitment to improve the IT system and enable our customers to apply for their licensing online and in turn allow us to finalize our approvals in an efficient and effective manner.

To overcome some of our challenges we faced in 2017, the government has approved to increase our budget and human resource capacity as requested in our budgetary report for 2018. This increase in funds will help to enhance and improve our services that we offer to the Kingdom of Bahrain.



#### **NHRA** vision and goals

The National Health Regulatory Authorities' (NHRA) vision is to promote safe and high-quality care in the Kingdom of Bahrain. In 2016 the Supreme Council for Health approved the five-year strategy plan for NHRA which aims to achieve the vision through 3 strategic goals.



Of the thirty initiatives that were included in the strategy, NHRA was successful in implementing 84% of the initiatives by the end of 2017.

#### **Overview of NHRA Strategy**

The National Health Regulatory Authorities vision is to promote safe and high quality in the delivery of health care in the Kingdom of Bahrain. In 2016, the Supreme Council for Health had approved the five-year strategy plan for NHRA which aimed to achieve the vision through 3 strategic goals. In total 30 initiatives were included in the strategy, by the end of 2017 NHRA had implemented 84% of the initiatives.


#### **Partnership & Contracts**


#### **Health Care Facility Regulations**

In 2017, the total number of registered healthcare facilities in the Kingdom of Bahrain reached 761. The NHRA has seen a significant increase in the applications for new medical centers in Bahrain due to an open market strategy by the Kingdom. The majority of these applications have been for general medical centers, dental centers, complementary medicine centers, and dermatology centers. At present there are 194 medical centers in Bahrain.

The greatest concentration of healthcare facilities and services in Bahrain has been within the Capital Governorate. The Capital Governorate has 76% of all hospitals, 78% of all private hospital beds, 55% of all medical centers and 68% of all clinics within Bahrain.








#### **Distribution of Medical Centers**






#### **Distribution of Specialized Medical Centers**





#### **Types of Violations Identified During Inspection Visits**







# Professional Regulations In 2017, the NHRA saw the number of registered healthcare professionals increase to 28,466 from 23,987 in the previous year. These professionals consisted of 6,131 doctors, 1,098 dentists, 14,395 nurses, 1,887 pharmacists and 4,550 allied healthcare professionals. Pursuant to the decision of the Supreme Council of Health to link the renewal of licenses of healthcare professionals to continuing professional development (CPD), the authority approved 3,022 training programs, including conferences, workshops, scientific forums and lectures. In addition, the NHRA

has approved 12 new clinical trials in the private and public sectors.


Total number of Healthcare Professionals Registered in the Kingdom of Bahrain:







#### **Pharmaceutical Products Regulations**

The total number of drugs registered at NHRA has reached 3760 drugs, 311 CAM products and 729 health products.

In 2017, the Supreme Council of Health issued Resolution 41 for the implementation of a track and trace system for supply chain of medicines in the Kingdom of Bahrain. This resolution states that it is mandatory by December 2019, for all the medications entering Bahrain to have the Two-Dimensional Barcode printed on the packaging of the product in accordance with the standards set by Global Standards One (GS1).

The barcode shall contain the following:


- 1. The Global Trade Item Number (GTIN) of the Medicine.
- 2. The expiry date of the Medicine.
- 3. The batch number.



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









### Distribution of Approved CPD Activities According to Speciality





#### **Clinical Trials Submissions by Sector**












# Distrubution of Complaints, Incidents and Lawsuits by Health Sector

# Distribution of Lawsuits According to the Most Frequent Specialty







#### **Implementation of the National Accreditation Program**

The journey of implementing the National Accreditation program began in November 2016 with the preparation of the legal infrastructure and detailed review of the accreditation standards. Thereafter, a rigorous training program was conducted over a span of a couple of months and our first hospital visit for accreditation was in May 2017. Since then we have successfully accredited 14 healthcare facilities.


NHRA is committed to ensure the high quality of health services provided, and that these services are rigorously evaluated and continuously monitored so as to establish and maintain public confidence of the healthcare system in the Kingdom. Furthermore, we have made accreditation mandatory for all licensed healthcare facilities.

NHRA's fundamental principles for accreditation include the following:

- To support and encourage **just-culture values**, **attitudes** and **practices** between NHRA and healthcare facilities
- To establish a strong, effective, constructive, mutually beneficial and **on-going partnership** with all healthcare facilities
- To adopt the **peer review approach**, that entails an in-depth discussion between peers rather than a "tick-box" method of auditing/inspecting
- To encompass key areas for quality improvement by **recommending** internationally accepted **evidence-based practices**
- To ensure that the **recommendations** made will be of **added-value**, that are **contextual**, appropriate, patient-centered, feasible and cost-effective for the facility

We now should take pride in the fact that Bahrain has a successful accreditation program, one of the first in the Gulf, which is based on international standards and guidelines, yet culturally relevant to the practice of medicine in the hospitals and medical centers in the Kingdom of Bahrain.


#### **NHRA Accreditation Implementation Timeline**






# **Accreditation Outcome Analysis Achievement of Core Elements**

#### The way forward

In the year ahead, NHRA aims to strengthen our relationship with our clients in the Kingdom of Bahrain. One of the initiatives to achieve this aim is to develop a comprehensive IT platform.

This will facilitate the licensing applications, drug and medical devices registration and sentinel event reporting processes thereby enabling NHRA to improve the efficiency of our operations and achieve a higher standard of customer satisfaction.

The way forward for some of our initiatives include:

- For Pharmaceutical Products Regulations: By May 2018 All pharmaceutical companies will be able to upload their products into our system to start the implementation of medication bar coding A global standardized system for traceability of medication
- For Accreditation: Implementation of accreditation of medical centers and continue private / public hospital accreditation
- With the implementation of the national health insurance system in Bahrain, the role of NHRA will expand to include approving the private insurance companies providing the insurance coverage
- Review and update professionals' legislation, Law 21 for private care facilities and the Pharmacy and Drug legislations.
